Dear Sir (or Madam),

Four and a half years ago a little pamphlet was published, a copy of which was sent to you, entitled "Historical Notes on The Foyer Suisse."

In this pamphlet the history of a scheme to provide for the Swiss Colony in London a Parish Hall and Home for young men was given, up to September, 1918. It was also shown how the war put a stop to the possibility of realising the said scheme.

The promoters, however, never lost sight of what they so fondly hoped to accomplish, but in view of the many difficulties which their efforts encountered, they came to the conclusion that their scheme was only realisable in the modified form and therefore decided to provide for the present a temporary house.

They have bought the lease of two suitable adjoining houses and entirely redecorated them. The premises contain twenty bedrooms, a public restaurant, smoking room, reading room, a lecture hall and other rooms suitable for letting to societies and for the activities of the Swiss Church.

The premises are called "The Foyer Suisse," and are under the control of a competent Swiss Manager, Mr. W. Meyer, who is assisted by the House Committee.

No effort will be spared to make "The Foyer Suisse" a real home from home for all Swiss people visiting it. Everyone, young and old will find there not only a Swiss atmosphere generally, but also every comfort, an excellent Swiss cuisine, electric light, baths (hot and cold), central heating, etc., and last but not least, moderate terms.

The "Foyer Suisse" is situated in the very heart of the Metropolis, and at the same time in a district well known for its quietude, in close proximity to the British Museum.

Please remember this when you hear of someone coming to London.
