Monsieur Jaques-Dalcroze is giving two lecture-demonstrations at the British Empire Exhibition, Wembley, under the auspices of the Dalcroze Society, as follows:—

Thursday, July 10th, at 8 p.m.—Illustrations by students from the training department of this school. The Right Hon. Charles Trevelyan, President of the Board of Education, has kindly promised to take the Chair (Parliamentary duties permitting).

Saturday, July 12th, at 2.30 p.m.—Illustrations (to include language eurhythmics) by girls from Moira House School, Eastbourne.

Monsieur Dalcroze will be assisted by Miss Gertrude Ingham and Miss Mona Swan.

Tickets for the lectures may be obtained from the Dalcroze Society, 7, Nicholas Lane, E.C.4 (5s. and 2s. 6d.); those for Saturday include admission to the Exhibition.

We hear that Monsieur Dalcroze, who is, of course, residing in Geneva, will spend the coming winter in Paris with the object of organising training courses for teachers of his method, and special classes for artists.

SWISS RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

Thanks to the spell of fine weather, the attendance at the shooting range at Hendon was most encouraging. Practice went on without a break, nearly three thousand rounds of ammunition being fired, and this only on the 100-metre automatic target. All those who have attended regularly are able to show a marked improvement in their scores. The previous record, established by Master Teddy Barbezat with 94 points (out of a possible 100), has been reached by Bruhlhard, other notable results being Affolter (92), Lampert (88), Krucker (87), etc. Practice with the Swiss army rifles on the 300-metre targets has had to be suspended owing to the Swiss ammunition proving somewhat destructive to the safeguarding wall constructed behind the targets; however, another layer of earth has been built up in front of the wall, so that firing can be resumed again.

Competitions will now be arranged for every week-end; the conditions will be exhibited on the notice-board in the firing hut. Some members have already acquired their own rifles, which is, of course, most conducive to obtaining top results. As regards the Swiss army rifles, a number have been lent by the Military Department in Berne; any member wishing to secure one for his own exclusive use should communicate at once with the range officer-in-charge.

Mr. C. LORLEBERG. †

We regret to announce the sudden death from heart failure, on the 11th inst., of Mr. C. Lorleberg, Gloucester Gardens, W., at the comparatively early age of 41. His remains were cremated at Golders Green on Tuesday, the 17th inst., and his ashes will be removed to Switzerland by his brother for interment in the family grave at Lucerne. Numerous and beautiful floral tributes bore testimony to the high esteem in which he was held by business colleagues and friends.

At the time of his death he was a director of Messrs. R. W. Greeff & Co., Ltd., Thames House, E.C.4, having been in the employment of this important concern for 21 years. He was a keen and able business man and a member of the Society of Chemical Industry.

He was elected a member of the City Swiss Club in February, 1912, but his absorption in business affairs prevented him from taking any prominent part in the social affairs of the Club or the Swiss Colony in London.
