Ces Messieurs ne manquent pas de se représenter les difficultés que nous rencontrons dans la grande ville de Londres, mais d'autre part il ne faut pas oublier la cordialité avec laquelle les Suisses sont traités en Angleterre. Ils sont à l'aise ici et c'est pour eux un sentiment très agréable et très réel. Bien regrettablement le chômage qui sévit en Angleterre ferme la porte à tant de nos jeunes compatriotes qui auraient pu venir ici faire valoir la solide instruction qu'ils reçoivent au pays, et venir augmenter le nombre des membres du C.S.C. Nous déplorons les circonstances qui nous privent ainsi de grossir les rangs des jeunes et vieux dont la constante fidélité est un don naturel du sol natal.

Je n'abuserai pas de vos moments précieux mais je tiens à soullever toute la sollicitude avec laquelle chacun s'efforce de rallier autour de son chef la colonie suisse de Londres. Parmi ceux qui s'occupent de nos intérêts ici sur place j'aimerais citer Monsieur Martin, Attaché Commercial à la Légation, et Monsieur Rezzonico, également de la Légation.

Je vous prie, Messieurs les Conseillers, de croire que nul contact ne pourrait nous être plus agréable que la présence de Suisses, et en particulier de représentants aussi distingués que les magistrats que nous avons l'honneur de voir à notre table.

**SWISS RIFLE ASSOCIATION.**

For the first time since its existence the Swiss Rifle Association took part in this year's Bisley Competition (the Small-Bore Rifle Meeting). Ten members were selected to make up two teams of four each, with two reserves. The results obtained were fairly good, but nothing really to be proud of in comparison with some of the results of other crack teams. Of course, we could not expect to "top the bill" for the first time of asking, and we hope to do better next year, when we shall also compete over the larger distance.

A friendly match has been arranged between the well-known Wandsworth Borough Rifle Club, Lyons' and ourselves, to take place at the Lyons' Ground at Sudbury on Saturday, the 25th July. A team of ten from each side will compete over distances of 25, 50 and 100 yards respectively. The eight best results out of the ten to count. We hope to get a very strong team out and to give the other teams "a good run for their money."

The competition which was arranged in conjunction with the Swiss Sports was shot over again on the last week-end. The results were not quite up to our standard, this being due, no doubt, to the conditions under which the competition was held, viz., only three trial shots being allowed. The prizes will be distributed on Saturday afternoon, August 1st, on our Ground at Hendon, when we hope to have a big gathering. We are also holding a "Bundesfeier" competition on that day, which is open to members and friends. Entrance fee 2s. for all competitors (with unlimited practice).

Shooting takes place every Saturday afternoon and all day Sunday on the two automatic 100-yds. targets, also on the latter day on the three 300-yds. targets with Swiss and English Army Rifles.

**SWISS SPORTS.**

A well-attended Delegates' Meeting of the Swiss Sports Committee was held on Tuesday, June 30th, at the "Schweizerbund," Charlotte Street. Mr. C. A. Barbezat was in the Chair.

The accounts of the Sports Meeting held at Herne Hill in May were presented by the Hon. Treasurer, Mr. H. Senn, and were approved by the delegates, who heartily congratulated the Organizing Committee. The meeting decided that the whole of the balance of £17 5s. 6d. should be handed over to the Georges Dimier Fund.

It was generally regretted that Mr. Kiefer did not see his way clear to accept any further the post of Secretary, which he had filled with distinction and untiring energy for five years.

The discussion on the various agendas ran with the smoothness usual to Swiss Sports Meetings till 10.30, when the President declared the meeting closed.

J. E. Muller, who died on the 4th July on his way home from business, has resided in London for about 20 years and was a very well-known person in Swiss circles, although of late years his business duties took him away from England for the greater part of the year. He was a representative of Messrs. A. Gagnière & Co., Ltd., 34-36, Golden Square, W.1, since 1916, travelling in Russia during the war and subsequently in the Near East. His was a charming personality, and both his personal and business friends deplore his early death at the age of 47. He took a great interest in the affairs of the Colony and was a member of a number of Clubs, always willing to help by word or deed. Those who knew him will miss him, and their sympathy goes out to his widow and three children.
