NOUVELLE SOCIÉTÉ HELVÉTIQUE. GROUPE LONDONNIEN.

Meeting of the Council on Wednesday, January 21, at 28, Red Lion Square, W.C.1.

1. The Treasurer had again to report two admissions, though, on the other hand, he had this month to announce several resignations, most of them due to members leaving London. There are still some subscriptions outstanding for 1924, but these have been greatly reduced in numbers lately, and it is hoped to decrease them still further before very long.

2. All the Councillors were of the opinion that the dinner on January 13th had been most successful in every way, the only criticism being that it might be well, another year—not to have a long speech, perhaps, but to have at least a few words said about the N.S.H. and particularly call attention to the Annual General Meeting in February. It was accordingly agreed that this would be done, should it be decided to have a dinner next year.

3. The President read the report of the meeting of the Delegates of the London Swiss Societies—which arrange lectures and different social functions—which took place at the Secretariat of the N.S.H. on January 8th. From this report it was seen that something really had been done towards coming to some arrangement to prevent the frequent overlapping of different events, which has occurred so often in the Swiss Colony here in the past. Henceforth, a register of all the meetings, dinners, etc., arranged by the London Swiss Societies will be kept at the office of *The Swiss Observer* by the kind consent of Mr. P. F. Boehringer, and also at the Secretariat of the N.S.H. (28, Red Lion Square, W.C.). All societies will, therefore, forward in future their proposed programmes to these two offices, and then, when any society wishes to hold a special lecture or social function of any sort—i.e., one which would not take place on one of the fixed dates usual for their meetings and known to the other societies already—they would only have to ring up the office of the S.O. or the Secretariat of the N.S.H. to find out whether the date they had in view was already booked by another society or not.

4. The President drew the attention of the Councillors to a letter which had been sent to the *Evening Standard*, protesting against certain incorrect and misleading statements which had appeared in that paper with regard to the works of Carl Spitteler, and also to a letter received from the Committee organising the 80th Fête Fédérale du Gymnastie in Geneva next July.

5. A letter was read from the Secretary of the Swiss Sports Committee, asking the Council of the N.S.H. to elect three of its members to represent the London Group of the N.S.H. on the Sports Committee. Three gentlemen were accordingly proposed, and it was unanimously agreed by the meeting that they should be our representatives, if they would be good enough to agree to help us in this way.

6. The President then laid before the meeting the names of the candidates whom the Committee thought suitable to propose for nomination as Councillors in 1925. These were all unanimously agreed to by the meeting, and one or two other names were suggested by some of the gentlemen present. Letters will accordingly be sent to the different candidates proposed, from whom it is hoped we shall receive favourable answers. It was furthermore announced that the Committee had thought that, if the Council was in entire agreement, the subscription for next year should also be fixed at 10s., and this was unanimously agreed to.

Le procès-verbal de la séance de janvier est lu et approuvé, puis lecture est donnée d'une lettre de Monsieur W. Rappart, notre nouveau membre honoraire.

Il y a une admission comme membre actif. D'autre part l'assemblée approuve avec regret deux

démissions provenant de membres qui ont quitté l'Angleterre.

Acte est pris du rapport de l'assemblée des délégués de différentes sociétés suisses de Londres convoquée sous les auspices de la N.S.H. en vue de discuter si possible la répartition plus rationnelle des fêtes et réunions de la Colonie.

Sur la demande du Comité des Sports Suisses, le Club nomme MM. Boehringer, Oltramare et Despond comme ses représentants au sein dudit Comité pour l'année courante.

Une discussion s'engage au sujet de l'ordre du jour de la prochaine séance et il est décidé que vu l'importance de celui-ci, les membres seront convoqués par circulaire. Notre bibliothécaire attire ensuite l'attention des présents sur différentes questions ayant trait à son département et sur la circulaire qui a été adressée aux membres par M. C. F. Loosli de Bümplitz concernant la mise en vente de copies du portrait de Carl Spitteler dessiné par Ferdinand Hodler en 1915.

Mention est faite de la parfaite réussite de la dernière Cinderella, ainsi que des dates des deux prochaines cinderellas qui seront annoncées par avis spécial dans le *Swiss Observer*.

La séance est levée à 8 h. 45.
