Following this, the several Committees of 1926 were duly discharged, after having been heartily thanked for the efficient manner in which they had carried out their duties, and Mr. P. F. Boehringer acted as President *ad interim* whilst the formation and election of the new Committees took place. The result of the ballot was declared at 11.45 p.m., and the wellbeing of the Society for 1927 is now placed in the hands of The President, Mr. A. C. Stahelin; Vice-Presidents, Messrs. B. May it prove a source of unending contentment and enjoyment to all our members, and a welcome haven of rest to those who feel tired after their battle with the exigencies of everyday life. Make our Society the object of your enthusiasm, for your own good, to the honour of those who have laboured before you, and for the sake of those who come after you.
