**SWISS SPORTS.**

A Delegates' Meeting was held at the Union Helvetia, Gerrard Place, on Friday, September 21st. Mr. C. A. Barbezat being absent owing to important business engagements, Mr. R. de Cintra, Vice-President, took the chair.

A fair number of Delegates attended. After the minutes and correspondence had been dealt with Mr. H. Senn, Treasurer, presented his financial report, a copy of which is printed below.

A surplus of £15 7s. 1d. resulted, and it was agreed by the Meeting that this sum should be given to the Fond Dimier. Mr. Dupraz, on behalf of the Fonds de Secours, accepted the donation with heartfelt thanks.

Mr. de Cintra tendered the resignation of the Permanent Committee, whereupon Mr. G. Goly took the chair as President *pro tem.* for the purpose of electing the new Committee. Mr. Goly proposed that the outgoing Committee should be elected *en bloc.* To this the Meeting unanimously agreed in wholehearted fashion. On taking the chair again, Mr. de Cintra thanked the Delegates on behalf of his colleagues for their renewed confidence and assured the Meeting that the Committee would give their best endeavours to make sure of an even bigger success next year. The Permanent Committee for 1928-29 is as follows: President, Mr. C. A. Barbezat; Vice-Presidents, Messrs. R. de Cintra and Con. Kiefer; Treasurer, Mr. H. Senn; Assis. Treasurer, Mr. A. L. Despond; Secretary, Mr. P. De Maria; Assis. Secretary, Mr. E. Block; Members, Messrs. R. Dupraz, C. Mayr and J. Sermier.

It was decided to hold the Sports Meeting next year on Saturday, June 1st, 1929, at Herne Hill. At the moment of going to press it is not certain whether the ground at Herne Hill will be available for Saturday, June 1st, in which case the Sports will have to be held on Saturday, May 25th.

Mrs. Rossier, the popular wife of our Steward, was asked to draw for the Bull Clock presented by Mr. Binguely, and graciously consented. The lucky winner was Mr. V. Rimoldi.

The first Delegates' Meeting next year will be held at the home of the Swiss Mercantile Society at Fitzroy Square.

After a lengthy discussion on proposals put forth by several Delegates with an eye to improve the organisation of the Meeting next year, Mr. de Cintra declared the Meeting ended. P.D.
