APPEAL FOR SWISS NATIONAL DRESSES.

The Swiss Committee of the League of Nations Union has again to arrange for a Swiss Contingent to represent the Swiss Colony at the Festival of Youth, organised by the London Branches of the League of Nations Union. Last year we took part in the international entertainments as well as at the massed gathering, and were represented by a contingent of over thirty members of different Swiss Societies. Our Historical Group, and also the different productions, was received and applauded with great enthusiasm on the part of our English friends.

As this year the Festival falls on the same day as the Swiss Sports, we have abstained from organising anything so elaborate and costly as last year, but as Switzerland has the seat of the League we found it almost our duty to be represented and have promised to appear with a contingent at the massed gathering.

To give again a little bit of colour to the group, we need a few National Dresses, and therefore I now appeal to those few ladies who are in possession of such dresses to take part in the function or, if this is impossible, to be good enough either to arrange for a deputy or to lend the dress to the Committee. The latter would, in this case, take all responsibility for the return of the dress in proper condition.

The Massed Gathering is timed for 6 p.m., but we have to be at the Palace at 5.15 p.m.

We are informed that almost all of the thirty nations taking part will send at least part of their contingents in national dress. This should also be possible for the Swiss Colony of London.
