INFORMATION SWISS NATIONAL TOURIST OFFICE.

Reduced Fares for "Hyspa" Visitors. (Berne, July 24th to Sept. 20th.). Visitors to the "Hyspa," Berne (Swiss Exhibition of Hygiene and Sport) can now have reduced fares in the sense that the single ticket to Berne may be utilised for the return journey to the starting-point. The tickets are valid for six days. In order to be utilisable for both ways they must be stamped at the Exhibition. Travelling to Berne at these rates starts on July 22nd at the earliest and ends on September 22nd.

No reduction is made on the express train supplement, which must be paid in full on both journeys. Information can be obtained from the Exhibition Secretariat and the Swiss National Tourist Office in Zurich and Lausanne.
