A memorial service for M. Theoring de Sonnenberg, late Counsellor to the Swiss Legation, was held at Notre Dame de France, Leicester Place, Leicester Square. Father J. Hanault officiated. Among those present were:—

**J. H. CORTHESE †**

Last Thursday week (October 15th), one of our compatriots who, in former years was well-known in the London Colony was quietly buried at the East Finchley Cemetery. We are indebted for the following notes to a relative of the deceased.

Jules Hippolyte Corthesse was born near Yevy, canton of Vaud, on the 20th June, 1859. He was educated locally and served an apprenticeship in the printing trade at Lausanne. A year after the completion of his military service in the Swiss Army, he came to London. In the middle eighties he became editor of "Le Courier de l'Europe," at that time the only French paper published in London, which however did not survive. In 1891, having set up a printing office in Newman Street, he launched another French weekly newspaper entitled "Le Courier de Londres," which in a few months met a similar fate to its predecessor. His literary activities and press connections secured for him in 1893 the post of secretary to the late Lady Cook, social reformer, and for some years he was occupied in disseminating views on social reform to a world-wide press.

From his earliest days he took a great interest in engineering problems and in the early nineties he began to take out patents, none of which, however, fructified to any great extent. Patents on steam navigation, living pictures, smokers' pipes, printing processes were taken out and in later years a number of patents on steam and gas turbines, and also a smoke consuming open fire grate, occupied his time. He died on the 12 October, 1931. He is survived by his widow and there is also a son by his first wife.
