NEW FEDERAL COUNCILLOR.

NEW FEDERAL COUNCILLOR.

M. Hermann Obrecht, a former National-Councillor, has been elected a member of the Federal Government in succession to Dr. Schulthess, who has recently resigned from his post.

The new Federal-Councillor was born at Grenchen (Ct. Solothurn) in 1882, the son of a watch manufacturer; he started his career as a teacher in Welschenrohr. In 1902, he entered into the service of the canton of Solothurn as secretary of the Finance Dept. During that time, he prepared himself for an examination as a solicitor, and in 1907 he took over the editorship of the newly founded "Solothurner Zeitung." Two years later, he entered the cantonal government, where he acted as head of the Finance and Military Departments; in 1917 he left the government voluntarily, and established himself as an advocate at Solothurn; in the same year he was elected a member of Parliament, (National-Council) as well as a member of the "Kantonsrat." M. Obrecht resigned his seat in Parliament in 1928, and five years later he left the "Kantonsrat" in order to devote his time to his professional duties. Until recently Federal Councillor Obrecht was President of the Board of the "Solothurner Kantonal Bank." In the Army he reached the rank of a colonel of infantry in which capacity he commanded a division during the 1934 manoeuvres.

M. Obrecht has rendered great services to his manoeuvres.

M. Obrecht has rendered great services to his native canton, and to the Confederation, and we are joining the Swiss Press in wishing him great success in his new and responsible office. (M. Obrecht is the 3rd Federal-Councillor hailing from the canton of Solothurn, the two previous ones were J. Munzinger and Bernhard Hammer).

THE ABDUCTION OF HERR JAKOB.

The Swiss Government's Note to the German Government on the subject of the abduction across the frontier of Herr Berthold Jakob on March 9th last is much praised in Swiss and international

In particular M. Motta's action is approved in taking his stand on the basic question of the violation of Swiss sovereignty and eschewing all legal quibbles.

That Herr Jakob was abducted by force there can remain not a shadow of a doubt. The Swiss memorandum of April 1st sets out with irrefuta-ble precision all the ramifications of the plot between Wesemann and Captain Hans Manz (a man high in favour with the Führer, who played a part in the massacres of June 30th to lure Herr Jakob over the German frontier. The German story simply will not hold water, and the Federal Government possesses all the evidence necessary for its complete refutation.

On all sides and by almost all shades of opinion throughout Switzerland the Federal Government's action has been applauded. The

jurists commend M. Motta for his strict adherence to the letter of international law.

The International Association of journalists Accredited to the League of Nations has sent M. Motta a telegram of congratulation.

At the time of writing no German reply to the Swiss Note has been received in Berne.

"AGENTS PROVOCATEURS" IN SWITZERLAND.

As a consequence of the recent kidnapping at Basle of the German-Jewish journalist Herr-Jakob, M. Baumann, chief of the Federal Department of Justice and Police, has drafted a Bill with the object of suppressing espionage and the activities of foreign agents prorocateurs in Switzerland. The Government have approved of the Bill in principle, and it is expected to come into force at the end of May.

DEFENCE OF SWISS FRANC.

The devaluation of the belga was followed, as had been expected, by big withdrawals of funds as nad been expected, by big withdrawals of funds frame. Switzerland and by an attack on the Swiss frame. The new chief of the Federal Department of Public Economy, M. Obrecht, and the directors of the Swiss National Bank have stated emphatically that there is no question of abandoning the gold standard.

According to the figures issued, the gold reserve of the Swiss National Bank in the week ending on April 6th decreased by 119,000,000f., but at the same time the banknote circulation was reduced by 32,500,000f. The gold was used for paying Swiss debts abroad; mostly for goods. On April 6th the gold reserve stood at roughly 1,600,000,000f., and the banknote circulation was 1,325,000,000f.

SWISS FEDERAL LOAN.

The Swiss Government has now made an ar-The Swiss Government has now made an arrangement with Swiss banks for the issue of a 3 per cent. loan of 100 million francs on behalf of the Federal Railways. The rate of issue will be 93.65 per cent. in addition to 0.6 per cent, for stamp duty. This loan will mature in 1960, but is redeemable by draw in 25 annuities. It is to serve for the partial conversion and redemption of the 5 per cent. Fourth Electrification Loan of 150 millions of the year 1924 and of the 5 per cent. LOCAL.

BERNE.

M. Johann Muller (Christian-Socialist) has been elected a member of Parliament (Nat. Council) in succession to the late Dr. Gesër-Robner. M. Muller was born in 1883 at Bütschwil, since 1924 he has been a member of the Grand Council of the canton of St. Gall.

The deceased was born in 1868 in Gossau, he studied law at the Universities of Insbruck, Freiburg, Lille and Zurich. From 1909-1924 Dr. Geser was a member of the Grand Council. For twenty-five years, he occupied a leading position in the Embroidery firm J. Rohner, A.G. He entered Parliament in 1922 ment in 1933.

Colonel Paul Lardy, a member of the Federal Instruction Corps from 1896-1918, has died at the age of 74.

M. Obrecht, the newly elected Federal-Councillor, received a great reception in Solothurn on his return from Berne. Dr. Haefelin, head of the cantonal government welcomed the new Magistrate on his arrival at the station. A procession numbering over 2,000 people was formed, which moved amidst the ringing of bells, and the firing of guns to the "Restaurant Schützenmatt," where a reception took place.
