FEDERAL.

SWISS PUBLIC WORKS AND DEFENCE.

By a referendum, the result of which was announced on Monday, the Swiss electorate, by 443,960 votes against 198,598, and by 19 cantons against three (Geneva, Vaud and Neuchâtel), has authorized the Federal Government to devote a sum of about £19,134,000 to the strengthening of national defence and to big public works with the object of combatting unemployment.

The scheme provides for an expenditure of about £8,221,000 for developing and improving national defence, and of £10,913,000 on public works such as the building and widening of several Alpine roads, the improvement of certain railway lines, and assistance to export trade and the tourist industry.

The necessary funds will be supplied by a new tax ranging from 1½ per cent. to 7½ per cent. on big shops, co-operative societies, and other commercial concerns which have several branches, and the yearly sales of which exceed £9,500,000, as well as on one-price shops. Another sum of £3,605,000 will be supplied by the Swiss National Bank, which will draw it from the profits of £31,634,000 it made on the devaluation of the Swiss franc. The remainder is to be supplied by the crisis tax, the levying of which has been prolonged for another period of three years.

CLIMBER'S DEATH IN THE ALPS.

Two Zürich tourists who were ascending the Saentis (8,215ft.), in Canton Appenzell, were overtaken by a violent storm. They had reached a place in the rocks from which they could not move. They dug a hole in the snow and spent the night there without food.

The next day, much exhausted, they tried to climb down, and fell 600ft. They had been seen by people in the valley, and a search party went to their rescue. One of the tourists, M. S. Baltensperger, from Zürich, was killed, and the other, M. Schmidt, a medical student, who has a fractured skull, was brought down in a serious condition, but is expected to recover.

SWISS EMBROIDERY EXPORTS.

Exports of embroidery from Switzerland in 1938 amounted to 26,100,000 S. frs., which was 1,600,000 S. frs. less than for 1937. Despite this the rate of employment of the Schiffli machines, which had declined to 64.5% at the end of 1937, rose to an average of 70% in 1938, and to 79% at the end of 1938. Of the 894 hand operated machines, about 300 were in regular operation during 1938, and between 100 to 120 were operated for irregular periods. In the first quarter of 1939 embroidery exports at 6,900,000 S. frs. showed a slight improvement as compared with the corresponding period of 1938 (6,300,000 S. frs.).

FRENCH MINISTER OF COMMERCE TO VISIT THE SWISS NATIONAL EXHIBITION.

M. Fernand Gentin, Minister of Commerce in the French Cabinet is shortly paying a visit to the Swiss National Exhibition in Zurich, he will also be received by the Federal Council in Berne.

FEDERAL SHOOTING FESTIVAL LUCERNE.

The Federal Council will pay a visit to the Federal Shooting Festival in Lucerne on June the 22nd, all the members of the Government will travel to Lucerne.

TWO AEROPLANE CRASHES IN SWITZERLAND.

M. Noel Riva, the pilot of a Sports machine and his passenger, M. Léon Droz, President of the Aero-Club La Chaux-de-Fonds, were killed when their machine crashed near La Chaux-de-Fonds.

A Sports machine belonging to the Aero-Club of Yverdon crashed near Echallens. The pilot, M. E. Savary, Dentist at Yverdon received slight injuries, his passenger M. Jean Dupasquier, also from Yverdon, was not injured.
