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THE "DOLMETSCH" CONCERTS.

The concert given on Wednesday, the 24th April, by members of the Dolmetsch Family and Joseph Saxby was very well attended and a great success.

As we entered No. 6, Queen Square, Bloomsbury, it was like stepping into another world far removed from the hustle and bustle and war.

The artists began the programme with a Suite for 4 Viols and Harpsichord by William Lawes, c. 1640.

The next item was two Consorts for 4 Recorders:—

- (1) Master Newmans' Pavane. *Master Newman.*
- (2) The Frog Galliard. *Thomas Morley.*

These instruments have an extraordinarily mellow and rich tone, and the ensemble was well balanced.

Then followed a Suite for Treble Viol and Harpsichord. This was an interesting piece and well executed.

Next on the programme were 3 early Italian pieces for small Harpsichord played by Joseph Saxby. These were so well received that Mr. Saxby gave an encore of music by Bach which showed us the Harpsichord at its best.

After the interval Marie and Carl Dolmetsch played us some unaccompanied music for 2 Recorders by Telemann, and altogether this was an excellent performance.

The next item was a solo performance by Miss Mabel Dolmetsch of "La Plainte" by Marin Marais, with Harpsichord accompaniment.

Miss Cecile Dolmetsch next rendered in a charming manner 2 songs by Scarlatti.

The programme concluded with a Sonata in E Major for Violin, with Harpsichord and Viola da Gamba, by Corelli. This is an exquisite work, admirably executed by Natalie and Carl Dolmetsch and Joseph Saxby. *F. W.*
