MOTOR PASSENGER VESSEL FOR LAKE OF THUN.

Some particulars of the motorship *Thun* recently constructed at Zürich by Escher Wyss for the Bern-Lötschberg-Simplon Railway Company's service on the Lake of Thun, are given in the *Escher Wyss News*. The vessel has a length of 128 ft. 6 in., a maximum beam of 16 ft. 6 in. and a moulded depth of 8 ft., the draught exclusive of the keel, is 3 ft. 9 in. It is equipped with a 250/300-h.p. Sulzer diesel engine driving a variable-pitch propeller; reversing and speed control is obtained by alteration of the blade angle. The vessel is fitted with both bow and stern rudders operated from the wheel-house by chains. A change-over device enables the steering to be changed from one rudder to the other; the one not in use is locked. The designed speed, when carrying 300 passengers, is 23 km. per hr. (12.4 knots), and the fuel consumption is stated to be 7.4 lb. of gas-oil a nautical mile. The vessel carries a crew of three men. The hull of the *Thun* was transported by road in two sections from Zürich to the western end of the Lake of Thun, a total distance of 60 miles. The largest section was 66 ft. long and weighed 14 tons. The shell of the vessel was completely welded up to the deck stringer at Zürich.
