CATHOLIC SERVICE. August 1st, 1943.

The invitation of the Committee of Swiss Catholics in London to a Solemn Sung Mass and Sermon arranged by the Chaplain to the Swiss Catholics, Fr. A. Lanfranchi, for 12.15 p.m., at St. Peters & St. Edwards Church, Westminster, S.W.1, met with a great response, in as much as when his Excellency the Swiss Minister and Madame Thurnheer arrived the Church was full of Compatriots united to render homage and thanks to Almighty God for having extended his protecting hand over Switzerland and preserved her from the fury of war.

The service was preceded by the singing of "Trittst im Morgenrot daher" and concluded by a heartfelt rendering of "Grosser Gott wir loben Dich." The sung mass rendered by the Swiss Catholic mixed choir augmented by a few male voices from the Westminster Cathedral choir, was the "Missa Salve Regina" by E. Stehli (St. Gall). It was a very solemn and impressive service, and Father Lanfranchi's short but well chosen and patriotic sermon went to everybody's heart.

The sanctuary was plainly but artistically provided with flowers in our national colours, the Papal, British and Swiss flags (the latter made specially for the occasion by the Swiss Nuns of Swiss Cottage) being part of the special decorations.

Both the sermon and service made a touching impression and were a favourable introduction for the Great Patriotic Rally which was to unite all Swiss in the afternoon.
