Jornot, who, true to his calling, has accepted the post of Minister at an orphanage in Chile, South America. He is at present on his way to his new field of labour for His Master and many of our compatriots will wish to join us in our prayers and good wishes for his future happiness.

We sincerely hope that our compatriots will support him by as regular an attendance at church as possible.
