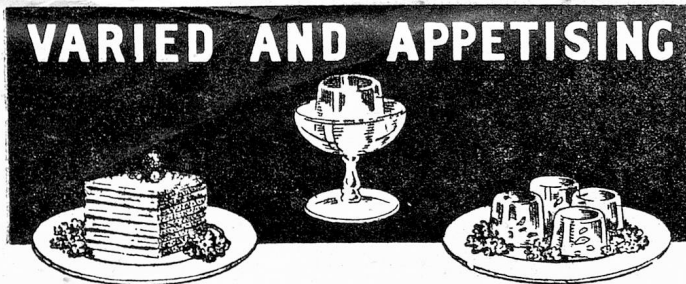
Readers are requested to make a special note of this forthcoming event, certainly not to be missed, and to watch the next months' issues for further details.

BETTAG-SERVICE AT ST. PETER'S CHURCH.

The Swiss Catholics gathered in goodly number for the "Bettag" Service on September 17th when, in the presence of the Swiss Minister and Madame Ruegger, the Chaplain, the Rev. Fr. Lanfranchi, sang High Mass, supported by the mixed Catholic Choir. Father Würms (of the Institute Bethlehem Immensee) preached the sermon, mentioning the wonderful graces of peace bestowed upon our country in 1914/1918 and again in the present world crisis; dwelling on the proof of the presence of the Creator in the magnificent sceneries of our land and mountains, not only as accepted by us Swiss, but recorded by three great British writers and personalities in the late Cardinal Newman, Hilaire Belloc, and lately by the great friend of Switzerland, Mr. Arthur Lunn.

Father Lanfranchi also announced that the Annual General Meeting usually held on the Bettag, had been postponed to a later date in the year. J. B.

INVALID ASPIC

Maggi's Aspic Jelly in a small mould daintily served with two or three small strips of toast will be a welcome change from "beef tea."

FISH ASPIC

Cod or Salmon remaining from the boiled fish can be used, also prawns or shrimps. Fill the mould $\frac{3}{4}$ full and when nearly set put in the flakes of fish and fill up.

MEAT ASPIC

Cooked fresh sausage meat or meat left over from the joints may be used minced. Drop the meat into the jelly before setting and serve with a little watercress or cress.

ASPIC SANDWICHES

Spread the slices of bread with margarine and then with a thin layer of jelly. Add grated cheese, watercress, mustard and cress, meat or fish paste.

JELLIED BEEF SOUP

A rich jellied beef soup may be made instantly with the addition of boiling water. Greatly appreciated by Fire-Watchers.
