## THE SWISS OBSERVER TWENTY-TWO YEARS AGO.

We give below a summary of some of the events which have taken place in the Swiss Colony twentytwo years ago (January to December 1924):

January, 1924: Xmas Tree celebration arranged by the "Eglise Suisse" at Morley Hall, about 100

Death is reported of Mr. V. Burkhart, a resident in London for forty years. He was keenly interested and instrumental in the development of the Union

Helvetia of which he was a founder.

February, 1924: The Swiss Colony learns of the passing of Mr. George Dimier at the age of 70. He was born on the 2nd February, 1854, at Fleurier, and educated in Geneva. Mr. Dimier came to this country in 1871, as representative of a family concern trading in Swiss watches. In 1901 he became the head of this concern and occupied an important position in the watch trade.

Mr. Dimier took a great interest in the Swiss Colony in London; he was President of the City Swiss Club, President of "Swiss House," President "Swiss Sports," Trustee of the Swiss Mercantile Society, President of the Swiss Benevolent Society, etc., etc.; in all his many offices he displayed great tact and patriotic fervour. Practically all his holidays he spent in Switzerland; he enjoyed the reputation of a keen mountaineer. His benevolence was proverbial.

The death is announced of Mr. C. Lorleberg, a director of Messrs. R. W. Greef and Co., Ltd., at the age of 41. He was a keen and able business man, and a member of the City Swiss Club.

Monsieur W. de Bourg takes up his duties at the Swiss Legation; he was formerly First Secretary of

Legation in Bucharest.

Monsieur Jaques Dalcroze is giving two lecturedemonstrations at the British Empire Exhibition at Wembley.

July, 1924: Death is reported of Mr. Emil Buser at the age of 66. Mr. Buser spent the best part of his life in England; he was a member of the "Commission économique Suisse" in London, and interested himself in the work carried on by the Swiss Institute, Swiss Mercantile Society and Nouvelle Société Helvétique.

Death occurred in London of Mr. John Walter Sterchi, Chancellor at the Swiss Legation, at the age of thirty. Mr. Sterchi, who was born in Sumiswald (Ct. Berne) in 1894, was appointed Chancellor of the Swiss Legation in London in 1915, and enjoyed great popularity in the Swiss Colony.
