The Assuan hydro-electric power station in Egypt is definitely to be fitted with Swiss turbines and dynamos. Representatives of Escher-Wyss, of Zurich, and Ateliers des Charmilles, of Geneva, have signed the final contract at the Egyptian Ministry for Public works.

Switzerland has concluded a trade agreement with Hungary for the next 12 months. Hungary will supply agricultural products worth Frs.23,000,000 (£1,330,000) and industrial products valued at Frs.36,000,000 (£2,750,000) in return for Swiss exports consisting mainly of machinery of Frs.12,000,000 (£692,000).

A financial agreement on capital transfers was reached simultaneously in talks at Berne lasting over five weeks. Hungary's trade and financial delegations were led respectively by M. Alexander Ronai, Minister of Trade, and Dr. George Kemeny, Secretary of State.

Lloyd's Underwriters in London may now also extend their activities to include Switzerland, with all kinds of insurances, but excluding life and transport insurance, a licence having been granted to them by the Swiss Federal authorities.

The Swiss Government has decided to abolish restrictions, imposed in March, 1945, on the import and export of foreign bank notes.

The Federal Council has nominated Minister, Dr. W. Stucki, to represent Switzerland at the International Commercial Conference which will begin on the 21st of November at Havanna. He will be accompanied by Dr. M. Fumasoli, Counsellor of Legation, at the Swiss Legation in Madrid, Dr. H. Hauswirth,

Chief of Section, Federal Economic Department, Dr. F. Real, 1st Secretary of Legation, and Dr. J. Humbert, Attaché at Swiss Legation in Buenos-Aires.

Cesare Lucchini, until recently, Director of the District II of the Swiss Federal Railways, has been elected General Manager of the Swiss Federal Railways in succession to Dr. Maurice Paschoud, who has retired on reaching the age limit.

The 37 years old post-master Hegetschweiler, after closing the office was busy making up his accounts, when a stranger entered through a back door, and struck a blow at his head which killed him outright. About the same moment the nine year old son of the post-master arrived, and he too was attacked by the intruder and seriously

injured (the boy has since died). The murderer then got hold of a cash box containing an amount of 5.700.—frs.

On leaving the premises he was surprised by an assistant, who, on seeing the two bodies laying on the floor, called for help, the attacker then took to his heels with the booty.

The police was called in, and after two days intensive enquiries were successful in arresting a man by the name of Streuli, a commercial traveller from Adliswil. He was interrogated, and charged with murder. Streuli confessed and whilst the examining magistrate walked to the door to call in the police, the murderer opened a window and jumped out of the office which was on the third floor. He was killed instantaneously.

Streuli, who was married, was reported to be in financial difficulties, he had been on several occasions assisted by Hegetschweiler, who was a friend of his.
