On Tuesday, May 25th, they gave a concert at the Albert Hall in aid of the Royal Air Force Benevolent Fund, with the co-operation of the Central Band of the Royal Air Force.

As the items on the programme are almost identical with those which will be given at the Central Hall on Monday next, we will not deal with them now as the element of surprise usually adds to the interest of the performance.

It can, however, be said that the crowded house gave our countrymen and countrywomen a very hearty reception, and the applause after each item was spontaneous.

On Wednesday they gave a performance in the Gardens of Buckingham Palace in the presence of their Majesties and the Royal Family on the day of H.M. Queen Mary's birthday, and on Thursday they were received by the Lord Mayor of London at the Mansion House.

We are now looking forward to meet our friends at the Central Hall, Westminster, where, we are sure, they will get an enthusiastic reception. It is going to be a fine performance, judging from the Albert Hall display, very colourful, at times a "little loud" but above all very homely.
