C. TH. LEHMANN †.

We deeply regret to announce the passing away, on Friday, May 21st, 1948, of Mr. C. T. Lehmann, at the age of 64.

Mr. Lehmann, was born at Langenthal (Ct. Berne); on finishing his schooling he entered, after an apprenticeship with a private Banking concern in Neuchâtel, the Banque Fédérale in Zurich, and later on the Banque Commerciale in Neuchâtel.

He arrived in London in the year 1906, and obtained a post with the Swiss Bank Corporation, first in their book-keeping Department and later on in the Foreign Exchange section.

Through his painstaking work he was in 1920 appointed attorney. C. T. Lehmann was a hard and conscientious worker and his death is greatly deplored by the Management and his former colleagues, who found in him a genuine friend. He retired on a pension on September 30th, 1941, he leaves a widow and three children (two sons and a daughter) to whom we extend our most sincere condolences.

In spite of his exacting work with the Bank, C. T. Lehmann found time to interest himself in the Swiss Colony in London, where he held the post of President of the Swiss Mercantile Society in 1932/33.

A lovable man has parted from us, and his all too early death will be deeply regretted by all who have known him.
