The Swiss Colony in London is about to lose one of its oldest members in the person of Mr. F. H. Rohr, who is leaving London for his new abode in France.

Mr. Rohr, came to England in 1898, at the early age of twenty-two as a pastry-cook. Amongst some of the positions he has held were at the Grosvenor and Manchester Hotels, the Trocadero and for some twenty-five years he occupied the post as Manager of the famous firm De Bry in London.

In 1925, he took over the well-known Confiserie Alfred Meyer at 10, Buckingham Palace Road, S.W.1, which establishment became, under his experienced direction, one of the best-known in this particular trade; the business is now carried on by his son.

Although somewhat of a retiring and modest disposition, Mr. Rohr took a great interest in the life of the Swiss Colony in London, he was, at one time President of the Union Helvetia, and also a member of the Société de Secours Mutuels, City Swiss Club, Swiss Rifle Association and Swiss Benevolent Society, in addition our friend was for a great number of years a generous supporter of the Colony's paper, the "Swiss Observer."

During his long stay in London, exceeding the half century, he made many friends, and wherever he went he was a welcome visitor.

Mr. Rohr, will be sadly missed, his cordiality and his help to some of our compatriots in need, endeared him to us all, and we most sincerely wish him, and his wife, a happy and carefree eventide of a life which was well worth living.
