LECTURERS FROM SWITZERLAND.

A whole series of first-class lecturers from Switzerland will visit England in the course of the next few months in order to address the Swiss Colonies of London, Manchester, Birmingham, Leeds and possibly others. They are coming here at the invitation of the London Group of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique in co-operation with the Secrétariat des Suisses à l'étranger, Berne, the two organisations sharing in the costs of the voyage and stay here, apart from the first lecturer, Mr. Alfred Roth, who will be in London in the course of his professional duties as architect for the new Swiss Travel Bureau at Charing Cross. The lectures arranged so far are:

- 15th February, 7 p.m. — Mr. Alfred Roth, most prominent Swiss Architect, Editor "Das Werk," Zürich, speaking in English on "Contemporary Swiss Architecture" richly illustrated with lantern slides.
- 15th March — M. Theo Chopard, Swiss Trade Unionist and Publicist of note, speaking in French on "Swiss Social Problems." This lecturer is considered one of the most interesting figures of the Swiss Labour Movement, an excellent speaker.
- 5th April — Prof. Dr. Karl Schmid, Zürich, military expert of high literary distinction, speaking in German on "The Military Position of Switzerland in Europe."

One or two additional lecturers may be coming in May and June. In the meantime London will also see the visit of an internationally respected Swiss theologian, Prof. Emil Brunner, who is lecturing at

London University on the 7th and 8th of March. In conjunction with the Swiss Church a lecture and discussion is being arranged also for the Swiss Colony by the N.S.H. Full details will be published in the next issue of the *Swiss Observer*.

All the above mentioned lectures will take place at the Vienna Café, Berkeley Arcade, opposite Baker Street Station, starting at 7 p.m. The Swiss proprietor, Mr. Dubs, takes a special pride in providing hot meals and refreshments before these Swiss events. All Swiss and their friends are welcome.

SWISSAIR FLIES AGAIN TO U.S.A.

Swissair has decided to fly again to and from U.S.A.

The flights will take place once a week between April 29th and May 30th and twice a week after May 30th.

In the first period, i.e. between April 29th and May 30th, the Swissair planes will start every Friday from Switzerland and every Sunday from New York (Idlewild International Airport). After May 30th they will fly every Monday and Friday to U.S.A. and every Wednesday and Sunday to Switzerland.

A very useful change has been made which will certainly be appreciated by the numerous people who will be using the Swissair route to Europe this Summer: instead of calling once at Geneva and once at Zurich, the planes will call both airports on each West or Eastbound flight. This will permit travellers to reach any place in Switzerland within a few hours after landing.

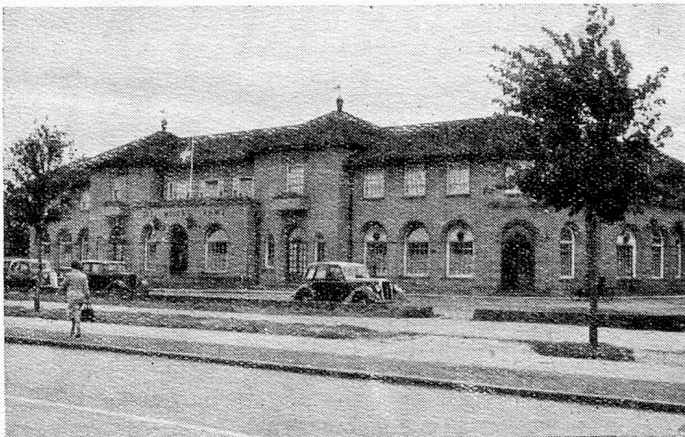
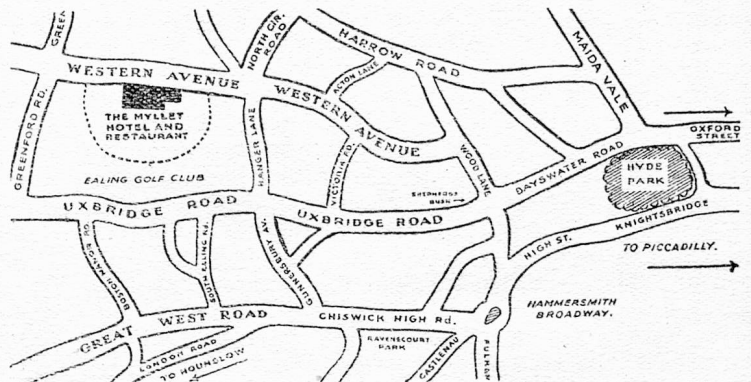
