NEWS AT RANDOM

Federal

Mr. Trygve Lie, General Secretary of UNO, who arrived in Geneva in order to study the question of housing some of the special Departments at the Palais des Nations, had an interview with Federal Councillor Max Petitpierre in Geneva.

The Federal Council has given a farewell dinner at the "Wattenwyl Haus" in Berne, to the Greek Minister, Monsieur Pierre Metaxas, who is retiring from the Diplomatic Service. He represented his country in Berne for the last three years.

* * *
The Political Department (Foreign Office) in Berne has received news that the Swiss in Bangkok (Siam) are quite safe and not affected by the recent unrest in this country. The Swiss Legation in Nanking has advised the Swiss Foreign Office that all Swiss nationals living in Tientsin (China) are unhurt.

A monetary Bill revising the regulations of 1931 has been published by the Federal Government. The gold equivalent of the Swiss franc will be 203.22 milligrammes, which puts the value of the gold kilogramme at Frs.4,920 40-63rds. This parity has actually been in force since the Devaluation Act of 1936.

The reason for fixing it by law is that the Devaluation Act — which foresaw a variable equivalent of 190 to 215 milligrams — is only valid until the end of 1949.

As a consequence of the new law, new gold coins are going to be minted, one of Frs.25 and one of Frs.50 worth. The size will be according to the newly fixed gold content of 20 and 25 millimeters respectively.

It was not felt convenient to change the size of the present 10, 20 and 100 francs worth gold coins, the nominal value of which does not correspond any more to the gold content nor to the actual market price.

An Indian trade mission headed by Mr. K. Chattur, of the Ministry of Commerce, is travelling to Berne to negotiate an agreement with the Swiss Government.
