Perceived merely through the medium of enjoyment Switzerland is like a picture book which is beautiful but obvious. Yet Switzerland is a country of extraordinary individuality, and the observer who takes the trouble to look beyond the surface finds more than a playground; he undergoes a rich and profoundly moving experience. For the charm of Switzerland lies not only in her lakes and mountains and glaciers, but in the relationship which exists there between mountain and man. The most striking, the most moving thing about Switzerland is the way in which her people have taken hold of the vast mountain wilderness and made it subservient to the needs and limitations of man. This little country held fast among the mountains, and the spirit of its people nurtured in the stern rigour of the Alps, cannot be fully understood without some serious and sympathetic consideration of their history and environment, and this book seeks to inform without disenchanting. Illustrated with 94 lovely and unusual photographs.
