## NEWS AT RANDOM

**Federal**

The Federal Council has appointed Monsieur Sven Stiner, Secretary of Legation, and until recently Swiss Consul in Hongkong, to the post of Chargé d'Affaires in Peking, promoting him at the same time to the rank of Counsellor of Legation.

M. Fernando Pedrini, a member of the Federal Insurance Office in Lucerne, has been elected by the two Chambers, a judge at the Federal Supreme Court in Lausanne.

Monsieur Zivota Djermanovic, the newly appointed Minister of the Republic of Yugo-Slavia has presented his credentials to Monsieur M. Petitpierre, President of the Swiss Confederation.

The new Minister was born in 1897 at Valjevo, and after having studied law at the University in Paris, established himself as a lawyer in his native town. At the outbreak of the last war, he was elected a member of Parliament, and finally occupied the post as Vice-President of the Yugoslav government.

The Newly appointed Minister of the republic of Columbia, General Miguel Sanjuan, has presented his credentials to the President of the Swiss Confederation.

General Sanjuan was, at one time, Chief-of-Staff of the Columbian Army, and lately Minister of Justice in the Government of Columbia.

Colonel Hans Muheim, Manager of the "Berner-alpen-Milchgesellschaft" and a former commander of the Infantry-regiment 7, in Düdingen, at the age of 55.

Dr. Werner Jordi, a well-known Bienné medical practitioner, in Bienné, aged 59.

Dr. Hans Zoelly, for many year Assistant-Manager of the "Eidgenoessischen Landestopographie Büro", in Berne, aged 69. The deceased was a *doctor honoris causa* of the Federal Technical University (ETH) in Zurich.

Dr. Albert Zellweger, Editor of the "Radio Zeitung" in Basle, at the age of 53.

Dr. Joseph Mühlé, Director of the "Kunstgewerbeschule" in Lucerne, at the age of 60.

Jean Reich, "Weltmeisterschütze" in Thal (Ct. St. Gall), aged 77. Reich took part in ten International Shooting competitions. In 1910, he obtained the title of "Weltmeister" at Loos-Duinen (Holland), where he obtained top scores in all three positions.

Dr. Balthasar Hofstetter, for thirty years President of the Urban Council of Kriens (Ct. Lucerne) and for many years a member of the Grand Council of the canton of Lucerne.

Pasteur Gérard Savary, for 17 years a preacher at the church of St. François, Lausanne, in Lausanne, aged 55.

Dr. Emil Bächler, from 1902-1947, Conservator and Head of the Natural Historical Museum in St. Gall. The deceased was a *doctor honoris causa* of the University of Zurich.

A Swiss-Israel society for the furtherance of trade between the two countries has been established in Berne, under the auspices of the Swiss-Israel Chamber of Commerce.

The society, to be known as "Sesi," is to operate in the following manner: on the conclusion of a sale in Israel by a Swiss company, the Israel purchaser will immediately pay one-third of the purchase price in a hard currency by banker's draft. The remaining two-thirds will be paid to the Israel offices of "Sesi" in Israel pounds, and the Swiss company will be reimbursed in Swiss francs by the "Sesi" offices in Switzerland.

This system will have the effect of developing commercial exchanges between the two countries, and has been warmly welcomed by Governmental and trade circles in Israel. During 1949, trade between Switzerland and Israel had a value of 27,000,000 Swiss francs.

It is understood that some 150 Swiss firms will join the society.

But there are other things to eat.


There's oysters, snails and caviare,
