NEWS AT RANDOM

Federal

Monsieur Eduard Feer, Swiss Minister to Brazil, will represent the Swiss Government at the installation festi-

vities of Monsieur Getulio Vargas, the newly elected President of the Republic of Brazil.

Monsieur Mohamed Abd el Moneim Mustafa Bey, Egyptian Minister, accredited to the Swiss Confederation, presented his credentials to M. von Steiger, President of the Swiss Confederation.

Monsieur Francisco Lousada, the newly appointed Minister of the Republic of Brazil, has presented his credentials to the President of the Swiss Confederation.

M. Robert Spichiger, Honorary Swiss Consul in Managua (Nicaragua), has retired from his post. M. William Tièche, at present on the staff of the Swiss Consulate General in San Francisco will succeed him.

The Federal Council has appointed Mr. Max Büchi, at present Consul in Tananarive, to be Consul in Manila, in succession to Consul Oscar Schneider.

Mr. Büchi, was born in 1901, in St. Gall and hails from Ettenhausen (Ct. Thurgau). He entered the Political Department in 1928 and he has successively held posts in Besançon and Cape Town.

M. René Manoux, since 1943, a Member of Parliament (National Council) has resigned his seat. He was a member of the Socialist party. He is succeeded by Mr. Ch. Strebel, President of the Fribourg section of the "Handels-Transport & Lebensmittelverbandes".

Dr. Albert Junod, a former Swiss Minister at St.

Petersburg, in Zurich, at the age of 86.

The deceased was born in 1865 in Paris, and was a citizen of Mutrix (Ct. Vaud). On the completion of his studies, he was for a number of years a tutor in Russia and Italy and later on occupied an important post at the Federal Economic Dept. in Berne. From 1918-1920, M. Junod held the post of Swiss Minister in St. Petersburg and on his return was appointed Professor of Geography at the University of Neuchâtel, of which he was a doctor honoris causa.

Otto Huber, a partner in the textile firm "Gebrüder Huber", of Kirchberg (Alttoggenburg). Mr. Huber was a Member of Parliament (National Council), from 1936-1939, and sat in the Grand Council of the canton of St. Gall from 1912-1945.

Richard Campell, founder of the "Engadiner Brauerei" of Celerina, and for many years President of the commune of Süs (Ct. Grisons), in Celerina, at

the age of 84.

Professor, Dr. Martin Rikli in Zurich, aged 83. The deceased was from 1899-1930 a teacher at the Federal Institute of Technology (ETH) in Zurich. For over 30 years he held the post of Conservator of the botanical collection of the ETH.

Mme. Maria Boschetti-Alberti, a well-known school-teacher, in Agno (Ct. Ticino).

Mme. Julia Schnetzler-Vincent for 23 years President of the "Frauenverein" Lausanne, in Lausanne, at the age of 89.

Professor, Dr. H. Rupe-Lutz, from 1903-1937, Professor of Chemistry at the University of Basle, in Basle, aged 85.
