VISIT OF LORD MAYOR OF ZURICH.

Dr. Emil Landolt, Stadtpräsident (Lord Mayor) of Zurich, has arrived in London on Saturday, March 3rd, for a short visit under the auspices of the British Council. He will meet the Lord Mayor of London and the Chairman of the London County Council.

His programme of visits included the Westminster Housing estate at Pimlico (March 5th), a meeting of the L.C.C. (March 6th), Westminster Hospital (March 7th), and the Lady Gonn Club, Bermondsey (March 7th). Scotland Yard have also arranged a programme on road traffic control on Tuesday morning, March 6th.

On Thursday, March 8th, he will go to Birmingham and will visit Queen Elizabeth Hospital that afternoon. On Friday, after a talk with the Medical Officer of Health and the Chief Education Officer, he will visit a primary and a secondary modern school. He will meet the Lord Mayor of Birmingham.

He returns to London on March 11th, when his official programme ends.

Dr. Landolt was elected Stadtpräsident in 1949 after being a member of the town council for seven years. He is "Zunftmeister" of the Zimmerleuten (Guild Master of the Carpenters' Guild), an honorary office of considerable importance in Zurich, where the Guilds play an active part in public and social life.
