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


Klosters,

situated on the way from Landquart to Davos, is the starting point of excursions into the Vereina and Silvretta region and to Parsenn, — for wanderers and mountaineers in the summer, for skiers in winter. Whereas in winter the Parsenn is the preferred region, easily reached from Klosters by aerial railway and suspension railway, the Silvretta and Vereina region almost exclusively belongs to the wanderer, the tourist, the hunter, and the fisher. This, however, requires time because the huts in Ferden, Silvretta and Vereina, are only reached after several hours by foot. But once reached the scenery is all the more beautiful with its mountains to be climbed, the peaks of the Silvretta range and the glaciers, the numerous lakes and the romantic passes to the Lower Engadin.

The guest who does not undertake more strenuous sports, will find plenty of amusements in Klosters to suit him. In summer he can bathe in the heated bathing-pool, play tennis or go fishing. In winter he can go sledding, skate or play curling. The skier can practice in Selfranga, where there is a ski-lift, or he can ride up to the Parsenn and enjoy the downhill run over Schwendi to Klosters. In summer and in winter one of the fastest suspension railways of Europe brings the holiday guest in 18 minutes from Klosters to Gotschnagrat, 7,544 feet above sea level, from where a wonderful panorama reveals the beauties of that region.

In Klosters resort life and village life exist side by side. Sturdy small houses and chalets nestle closely against the gentle slopes. In Klosters one can find peace and quiet in summer and in winter. There are many possibilities for those who like quiet walks, for experienced hikers, and for enterprising climbers. One finds something new, surprising and enjoyable every day.




The guests were satisfied with their stay, with quiet and beautiful situation of the hotel and last, but not least, with the excellent service of the personnel.






