CITY SWISS CLUB.

Dinner with the "Chanson de Lausanne".

An evening that will long be remembered was provided on the occasion of the City Swiss Club inviting the "Chanson de Lausanne" and members' guests at the Dorchester Hotel on the 12th of June. The meeting was distinguished by the atmosphere of easy informality as well as by the outstanding singing of the "Chanson de Lausanne."

Mr. Seinet, President of the City Swiss Club, opened the proceedings by welcoming the ladies, the Counsellor of the Legation, Mr. Bernath, the British Friends, Pasteurs Reverdin and Blum, Father Lanfranchi, Mr. Pache, President of the Chanson, and Mr. Guibat their Director. He was followed by Mr. Bernath, who expressed the Minister's regret at being unable to be present.

The songs which were mostly folk tunes were sung in short groups; the music of several of them was written and arranged by Mr. Guibat, who is also régisseur musical de Radio Lausanne. In the intervals apart from enjoying an excellent dinner the club was graciously thanked by Mr. Pache, who wished prosperity to the Swiss Colony. A cable was read from Mr. Chapuis at present in Hollywood. Further a large number of "saucissons", especially brought from Switzerland by the Chanson, were raffled by Mr. Dupraz. The lucky winners were entitled to a kiss from the distributors thus adding to the general amusement.

Mr. Seinet paid a warm tribute to the wonderful work of Mr. Renou in organizing the Fête Suisse and patronizing the Chanson de Lausanne.

The singers were all talented amateurs dressed in beautiful vaudois costumes either as bourgeois or as vignerons. They wound up a delightful evening with the prière patriotique of Jacques Dalcroze.

CONCERT NEWS.


