Our "Confederati" from the sunny south, after having taken part in the 1st of August celebration at Central Hall, Westminster, met again, a few hours later at the Dorchester Hotel, Park Lane, W. 1., to celebrate *en famille* the birthday anniversary of our country.

The Ticinesi are past masters at entertaining; all their functions are devoid of any stiffness or formality, they simply meet to enjoy themselves and be happy, and judging from their smiling faces they revelled in every moment of that successful evening.

Shortly before 8 o'clock, the music of Harry Vardon's dance band, lured both young and old on to the ball room floor and henceforth all was as merry as a wedding bell. Many of the revellers wore the becoming costume of the canton of Ticino, which added colour to the festive gathering.

Mr. De Maria shortly referred to the significance of the National Day and concluded by wishing all a very happy evening.
