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ADOLPH ALBERT BODENEHR †

It is with deep regret that we have to record the death of Mr. A. A. Bodenehr who passed away peacefully at his home, 17, Second Avenue, Acton, London, W.3., on Wednesday the 20th August in his 90th year.

Mr. Bodenehr was born at Liestal, and came to this country in 1883, and with the exception of about 6 years spent in Australia had lived in London since that year. In his day he was well known in catering circles, and enjoyed the acquaintance and friendship of many of his compatriots, especially those with whom he came in close contact through the culinary art.

He retired from his occupation as Head Chef, owing to ill health, more than 25 years ago, having been in the service of Messrs. J. Lyons & Co., Spiers & Pond, and other well-known caterers — his last engagement was at the Cannon Street Hotel where he had been employed for 10 years. He took a great personal interest in the Hotel Catering Trade, which even in those days had its problems and difficulties, and was a popular Director of the Union Helvetia which catered mainly for Hotel employees.

The funeral was at Mortlake Crematorium on Monday, 25th of August, and many relatives and friends followed. Mr. Bodenehr's widow is in her 87th year, and the deceased left surviving two married daughters, two grandsons and three great grand children, to whom we extend our sincere sympathy.
