There will no doubt take place a very keen international competition which will guarantee that all the main bodies of the international gastronomy will be represented in Berne early next summer. In this way an excellent survey can and will be made about the present standards prevailing in the art of cookery.

In respect of Great Britain's participation a special British Organising Committee of "The British Week" at the International Cookery Exhibition in Berne 1954 has been formed sometime ago, representing the main interests in this Country. This Committee is sponsored by the International Academy of Chefs de Cuisine and Association of Cooks in Great Britain in close association with representatives of:

Connecting services from London include:


SR. 111 "The Super Swiss" Convair service which will be in operation until the 18th October. Leaves London at 10.25 and arrives Zurich at 13.45.
