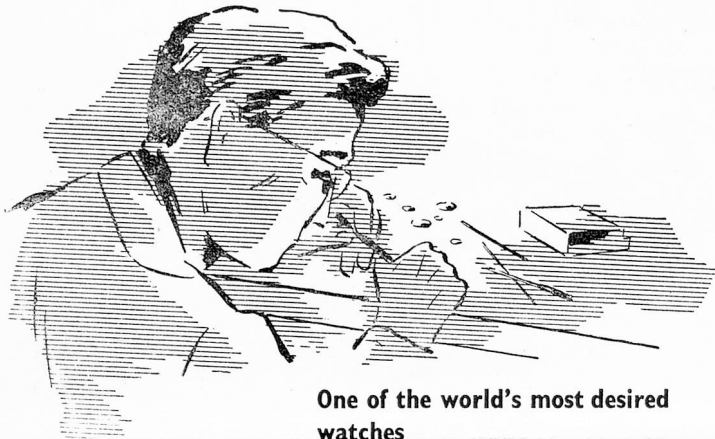

### SWISS CHURCH BAZAAR.

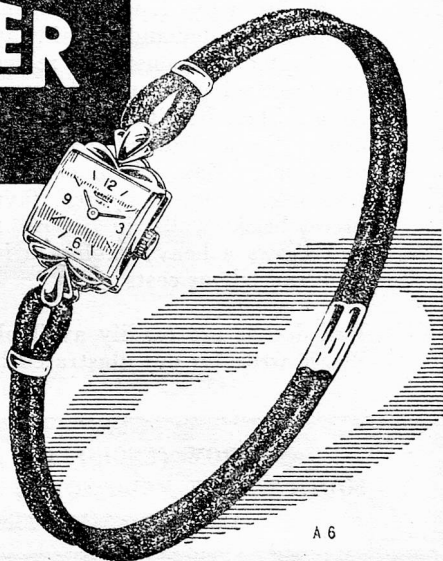
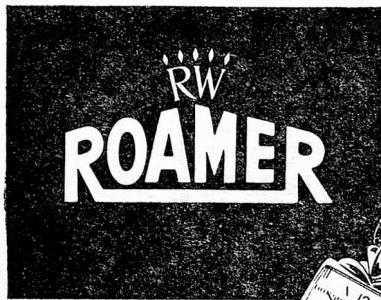
