"HEIDI AND PETER." New Swiss Film at the Pavillion.

All our readers, especially those with youngish children to give a treat, will be delighted to hear that a sequence to Lazar Wechsler's Heidi film, shown here a year ago, is now running in one of the leading West End cinemas, the Pavillion in Piccadilly Circus. It is of course based on Johanna Spyri's second book, "Heidi makes use of what she has learned". There they are again — all the beloved characters: Heidi, again played by Elsbeth Sigismund, the Alpen-Oehi, movingly represented by Heinrich Gretler, Peter the goatherd by Thomas Klameth, etc., etc. There you have again the same wonderful scenery from, I believe, the Ober-Engadin, be it up on the Alp or be it down in the village, all in the delicate hues of Eastman Colour. The touching story is told with reverence and sentimentality, the acting is good, the treatment of most episodes adheres faithfully to the book.

But we are sorry to have to mention also some shortcomings, the same shortcomings as in the case of the first Heidi film. The illusion of the charming scene and Swiss characters is greatly spoilt by some blatant Americanisms and the poor dubbing of the dialogue in strident American voices. Most Swiss listeners will find this irritating, although in all other respects "Heidi and Peter" will not fail to evoque nostalgic memories and delights.
