SWISS HOLIDAYS FOR U.K. SWISS CHILDREN.

The London Group of the "Nouvelle Société Helvétique" is again organising, in co-operation with "Pro Juventute" in Zurich, a holiday for children of 6-14 years, of Swiss parentage, who live in the United Kingdom, provided always that there is a sufficient number of participants.

As usual these holidays will start at the best and most attractive time to enjoy Switzerland, i.e. towards the end of July, and are scheduled to last some 4-8 weeks according to arrangements made by "Pro Juventute". It is hoped that the journey London-Switzerland and return may again be carried out in an aeroplane of SWISSAIR. Should this not be possible this time; the journey would be undertaken by rail.

In cases where parents would value such holidays for their youngsters but are not in a position to defray the cost of the journey, the N.S.H., in conjunction with the Swiss Benevolent Societies, would endeavour to provide the necessary funds. Applications for these assisted journeys should be addressed directly to the Swiss Benevolent Societies, or for the area outside Greater London to the appropriate Consulates.

As regards board and lodging in Switzerland, "Pro Juventute" offer various schemes, such as:—

- (a) Free board and lodging with Swiss families for a limited number of children whose parents are unable to pay either the whole or part of the cost. Only children holding Swiss Passports and/or Laissez-passer can be considered under this scheme.
- (b) Board and lodging at reduced prices of about 12/- to 15/- per day in a recognised children's home, selected by "Pro Juventute" available for children up to 12 years of age, only for children holding Swiss Passports and/or Laissez-passer.
- (c) A stay of about four weeks in various holiday camps, available for children of about 12-14 years of age, only for children holding Swiss Passports and/or Laissez-passer.
- (d) Children who are in the happy position of holding a written invitation from relations or friends in Switzerland are welcome to join the party for the journey both ways.

Parents who are not able to pay the whole of the cost, which is kept as low as possible, are entreated most earnestly to contribute as much as they possibly can in order to reduce the strain on the funds of the Benevolent Societies and "Pro Juventute".

It is expected that many Swiss parents in the United Kingdom will gladly avail themselves of this opportunity of enabling their children to enjoy a healthy and happy holiday of worthwhile duration in the most pleasant surroundings and scenery of our homeland.

Applications should be sent in writing not later than 12th April by Residents:—

- (a) In the London Area to Mr. W. Renz, 7, The Highway, Sutton, Surrey.
- (b) In the Consular District of Manchester to the Consulate for Switzerland, 53, Spring Gardens, Manchester 2.
- (c) In the Consular District of Scotland to Swiss Consul, Balloch, Scotland.

Whereupon parents will be supplied with all relevant information.

SWISSAIR ORDERS DOUGLAS DC-8s.

Swissair has ordered two Douglas DC-8 jet airliners. Delivery of the aircraft is scheduled for the spring and summer of 1960. They will be used on Swissair's most important long-distance routes.

Including spares they will cost a total of about £5,830,000.
