NEWS AT RANDOM

Federal

The Federal Council has appointed Monsieur Franco Brenni, at present Swiss Minister in Cuba, to the post of Minister Plenipotentiary and Envoy Extraordinary in Haiti with residence in Havanna.

The Consular Agency in Boston (U.S.A.) has received the status of a Consulate. Mr. Georges-Henry Barrel has been appointed Honorary Consul. He was born at La Chaux-de-Fonds in 1895 and is a citizen of this town. The new Consul has been in Boston for many years and occupies an important post in a commercial concern. In 1936, he was appointed Swiss Consular Agent.

The following diplomats have presented their credentials to Dr. H. Streuli, President of the Swiss Confederation and to Monsieur Max Petitpierre, Swiss Foreign Minister, at the Palais Fédéral in Berne: Monsieur Fernand Seymaeve, Belgian Ambassador, and Monsieur Petar Grigorow Bulgarian Minister.

The Federal Council has decided to raise the Swiss Consulates in Monrovia (Liberia) and Accra (Ghana) to the status of Consulates General. Mr. Rudolf Scheurer has been nominated Honorary Consul General, and Mr. Eduard Brugger has been promoted to the rank of Consul General.

The Swiss Federal Railways have carried 18.6 million passengers in the month of July, 1957, or 200,000 more than in July, 1956. Receipts: 36.8 million francs. (July, 1956: 36.5 million francs.)

2,420 million tons of goods traffic was transported, an increase of 109,000 tons over last year's July figures. Receipts 44.9 million francs. (July, 1956: 43.3 million francs.)

Customs receipts for the month of July, 1957, totalled 89.3 million francs; of this amount the

Confederation receives 66.6 million francs or 4.9 million francs more than in July, 1956.

The Swiss Government has offered a luncheon to Monsieur Habib Burgiba, President of the Republic of Tunisia, who is on holiday in Switzerland.

The Swiss Confederation has during the year 1955, paid the amount of 420 million francs in subventions.

Professor Dr. Theodor Heuss, President of the German "Bundesrepublik", who has spent his holiday in Switzerland, paid a courtesy visit to Dr. Streuli, President of the Swiss Confederation. The distinguished visitor was the guest of the Federal Council at a luncheon.



DEATHS.

The following deaths are reported from Switzerland:

Jean Spiro, president of the lawyers association, and a former member of the Grand Council of the canton Vaud, in Lausanne, at the age of 84.

Professor Alderige Fantuzzi, in Mendresio. The deceased was for ten years Director of the Agricultural Institute, Mezzana, and for many years Professor of Agronomy in Locarno.

Julius Pentman, a well-known Journalist, in Geneva, at the age of 73.

Hans-Ulrich Akeret-Ribo, partner in the publishing firm Akeret, Buelach, aged 28.

Sylvestre Pilloud, President of the commune of Chatel-Saint-Denis, and a member of the Grand Council from 1926 to 1951, in Chatel St. Denis, at the age of 67.

Fritz Ringwald, Vice-President of the Board of the "Central-Schweizerischen Kraftwerke" Lucerne, and President of the Board of the "Elektrizitaets Werke Altdorf und Schwyz", in Lucerne aged 83.

Divisional Colonel Gustave Combe, in Orbe, at the age of 75. The deceased was from 1935 to 1940, commander of the 1st Division. From 1940 to 1948, he occupied an important post on the General Staff.

Ernest Landry, Director of the slaughter-house Geneva from 1927 to 1955, in Geneva, aged 62.

Dr. Ulrich Diem, a former Director of the Municipal Theatre of St. Gall, in St. Gall at the age of 86.

Dr. Victor von Castelberg, from 1931 to 1953, a member of the management of the "Schweiz Rückversichverungs-Gesellschaft" Zurich, in Zurich aged 67.

Rudolf Huber, in Altdorf at the age of 75. The deceased was from 1934 to 1952 a member of the Government of the canton of Uri. From 1926 to 1946, he occupied the post of "Platzkommandant" of the town of Altdorf with the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel.

Charles Nicoud, for many years Manager of the PTT administration. (District Neuchâtel), in Corcelles, aged 82.

Dr. med. Léon Picot-Roux, a well-known surgeon and for seven years commander of the "Militär Sanitäts-Anstalt 2" with the rank of Colonel, in Mont-La-Ville at the age of 69.

Dr. med. Jean Olivier, head of the Butini hospital, and general-secretary of the Geneva medical association, in Gryon-sur-Bex, aged 82.

Mlle. Ida Ingold, a well-known painter, in Hilterfingen (Ct. Berne) at the age of 76.

Walter Wyss, President of the Tribunal Thalgaeu (Ct. Solothurn), and from 1941 to 1945 a member of the "Kantonsrat" Solothurn, in Solothurn aged 58.

Mario Chiattone, a well-known architect, in Lugano, at the age of 66. [A.T.S.]



made man; born in humble circumstances, he started as a teacher at the secondary schools in Uster and Winterthur after having saved enough money he studied National Economy at the Universities of Zurich, Paris and London, and for a number of years he was a "Privat Dozent" at the University of Zurich.

From that post he was called by the former Federal Councillor, Dr. Schulthess to the Federal Economic Department, where he occupied the office of general secretary, and later on he became Director of the commercial division. In 1924, he left the Civil Service to enter the administration of the "Vorortes des Schweiz. Handels und Industrie Vereins" of which he became ultimately its President.

Dr. Wetter started his political career in the year 1924, when he was elected a member of the "Kantonsrat"; from 1929 to 1938, he was a member of the National Council. On December 1938, he was elected a member of the Federal Government. Dr. Wetter was President of the Swiss Confederation in 1941, and two years later (1943) he relinquished his post.

After his resignation he became President of the "Schweiz. Rentenanstalt" and of the "Aluminium Industrie A.G."

Charly Clerc (75) of Berne, author and formerly Professor of French literature at the Federal Institute of Technology (ETH) Zurich.

Dr. Werner Fehlmann (70) of Schaffhausen, Professor of "Fischereiwissenschaft" at the Federal Institute of Technology Zurich, and from 1918 to 1952 a teacher of natural science at the "Kantonschule" Schaffhausen.

Brigade-Colonel Dr. Hans Meuli (60) of Nufenen (Ct. Grisons) since 1946 "Oberfeldarzt und Chef der Abteilung für Sanität" at the Federal Military Department.
