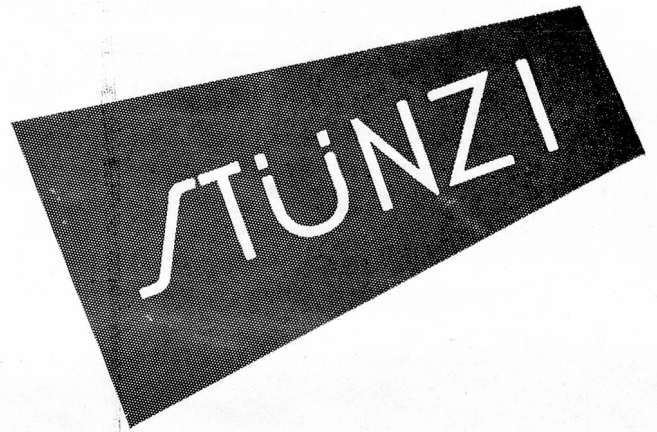
We wish him and his family many more years of success in this well-known catering concern.
