NOUVELLE SOCIETE HELVETIQUE. (London Group) RECENT ACTIVITIES.

The Société, after the summer recess, resumed their monthly meetings at Swiss Hostel for Girls on 21st October, when Consul Ribi, of the Swiss Embassy, displayed a number of most attractive colour slides, taken mostly during his long stay in Mexico. Consul Ribi succeeded, both by his pictures of high artistic merit and by his explanations, in conveying to the numerous audience a comprehension of the fascination emanating from the mysterious land of Mexico.

On 25th November the Société was addressed by Dr. H. Koeppler, M.A., F.R.Hist.S., O.B.E., on "New Aspects of Foreign Policy: Information and 'Culture' ". The speaker is a distinguished historian who, since the establishment under Foreign Office auspices in 1946 of Wilton Park, has presided over the destinies of that remarkable institution.

Wilton Park, near Steyning (Sussex), is a country mansion in lovely surroundings, where, away from the distractions of London, intellectuals from many countries forgather for concentrated discussion of political, social, and economic problems of common European concern. A considerable number of Swiss have participated in these conferences, some of whom, to name but two, Prof. Wildi and Dr. E. Richner, have also lectured to the London Group of the N.S.H.

Dr. Koeppler, a most accomplished speaker and master of his subject, treated members to a profoundly interesting lecture which led to a most stimulating discussion in which the Swiss Ambassador also took The Société is greatly indebted to His Excellency for his support in obtaining the services of this outstanding lecturer.
