NEWS AT RANDOM

Federal

The traditional conference of the heads of Swiss diplomatic Envoys abroad, took place in Berne under the presi-

dency of M. Max Petitpierre, Swiss Foreign Minister.

The Indian Finance Minister, Mr. Morarji R. Desay — on his journey to London and the U.S.A. was the guest of the Federal Council. He was received at the Palais Fédéral in Berne by Federal Councillors Petitpierre and Streuli. A dinner in his honour was given by the Federal Council at the "Wattenwyl Haus".

Monsieur Ignacio Portocarrero Lacayo, has presented his credentials to Monsieur Paul Chaudet, President of the Swiss Confederation, and to M. Max Petitpierre, Swiss Foreign Minister, as Minister Plenipotentiary and Envoy Extraordinary of the Republic of Nicaragua.

Customs receipts for the month of August 1959 amounted to 85.2 million francs. Of this amount the Confederation receives 54 million francs, or 2.3 million francs less than in August 1958.

Receipts for the Confederation during the first eight months of the year total 669.9 million francs or 0.7 million francs more than during the same period in 1958.

The following National Councillors have intimated that they will not contest their seats at the next Parliamentary elections (24th to 25th October): Jean Gressot, "Regierungsstatthalter des Amtes Pruntrut", Ernst Josi (Radical) of St. Imier, Carl Beck of Sursee, and Giulio Gugliemetti (Liberal) of Mendrisio.

Cantonal

The firm "Messerfabrik Karl Elsener" of Ibach (Ct. Schwyz), on the occasion of its 75th jubilee has made a donation of 500,000 — francs to its pension fund.

Dr. Werner Kaempfen has been appointed Director of the "Schweizerischen Verkehrszentrale" Zurich, in succession to Mr. Siegfried Bittel, who has held this

post for 26 years.

Dr. Kaempfen was born in 1914, and hails from Brigue. After studying law at the University of Berne where he obtained his doctorate, he practised for some time as a lawyer. He also published a number of novels and biographies. From 1939 to 1949, Dr. Kaempfen was connected with the "Schweizerischen Depeschenagentur" Berne. In 1954, after having been active as a journalist, he was elected Director of the "Verkehrsverein" Zurich. [A.T.S.]

On 7th September 1959 the commune of Wetzikon (Ct. Zurich) numbered 10,000 inhabitants, and is, therefore, now considered to be a town.

DEATHS.

The following deaths are reported from Switzerland:

National Councillor Dr. jur. Karl Renold, in Aarau at the age of 71. The deceased studied law at the Universities of Dijon, Zurich, Berne and Leipzig, after which he established himself as an advocate and notary in Baden. From 1917 to 1925, he held the post of "Staatsschreiber" of the canton of Aargau, and from 1925 to 1956 he was Director of the "Aargauischen Versicherungsamtes". Dr. Renold had sat since 1943 in the National Council over which he presided in 1951-52. In the army, he held the rank of Colonel, being commander of a frontier brigade.

Ralph Lazrus, President of the Board of the watch manufacturing concern "Benrus", La Chaux-de-Fonds, in La Chaux-de-Fonds aged 60.

Dr. Alfred Gsell, Swiss Consul in Laurenço-Marques, at the age of 46.

Professor Dr. med. Felix Nager, from 1915 to 1947 Professor for ear, nose and throat diseases at the University of Zurich, in Zurich aged 82. The deceased was an honorary member of the British Royal Society of medicine.

Dr. med. Alexander Renfer of Lausanne, owing to a motoring accident at the age of 33.

Professor Dr. h.c. Hans Bernoulli, in Basle aged 83. The deceased was in 1912 appointed chief architect of the "Basler Baugesellschaft", and a lecturer at the Federal Institute of Technology (ETH) Zurich. Professor Bernoulli was at one time a member of the Grand Council of the canton of Basle-Town

and the National Council. The University of Basle honoured him with the degree of doctor honoris causa.

Dr. Adam David, in Basle at the age of 87. The deceased was a well-known natural scientist, author, and big game hunter.

Dr. Charles Tschaeppaet, Director of the "Société electrolytique", and from 1943 to 1959 a lecturer at the University of Lausanne, in Lausanne aged 65.

Dr. Carl Napp, for many years President of the "Hausbesitzerverein", and of the Basle section of the Swiss Automobile Club, in Riehen at the age of 68.

François Bourquin, pharmaceutical chemist in Couvet, aged 61. The deceased held the rank of Lieut.-Colonel in the medical corps.


Henri Borel, trade union secretary, and a member of the Grand Council of the canton of Neuchâtel, in La Chaux-de-Fonds aged 70.

Edmond Zaugg, a former member of the Grand Council of the canton of Geneva, and a member of the municipal council of Geneva, in Geneva at the age of 66.

Oscar Schweizer, Director and President of the Board of the Hotel School, Lausanne, in Lausanne aged 63. [A.T.S.]

ARMY.

The Federal Council has appointed Colonel Oskar Keller (50) of Reinach (Ct. Aargau) to the post of Head of the "Eidg. Kriegsmaterial Verwaltung" with promotion to the rank of brigadier, in succession to Divisional Colonel Schenk. Brigadier Keller studied





at the Federal Institute (ETH) Zurich, and entered the Instructors Corps in 1935. Until recently he held the command of the 15th heavy artillery regiment.

Dr. med. Max Herzog (70) of Zurich-Wollishofen, a noted medical practitioner, and a painter of some repute. [A.T.S.]

TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS.


