13th LANDSGEMEINDE OF THE SWISS IN THE NORTH OF ENGLAND



Mr. J. J. HUBER APPOINTED IN SYDNEY

The wide circle of personal friends in this country of Mr. J. J. Huber, until recently Consul in New York, will be delighted to hear that he has been appointed Consul-General in Sydney in succession to Mr. Hans Hediger, and we tender him our sincere congratulations.

Consul-General Huber was born in 1902, and is a citizen of Mägenwil (Ct. Aargau). He received his schooling at the "Bezirksschule" Zurzach, the "Handelsschule" and the "Collegium" Schwyz. In 1922 he entered the service of the Swiss Federal Railways, where he held appointments in Horgen, Le Locle, Zurich and Berne. Six years later (1928) he was transferred to the London Agency. At the outbreak of the last war, Mr. Huber was appointed Chancellor of the then Swiss Legation (Special Division, Foreign Interests). When the Division was wound up at the conclusion of the war, he was appointed Acting Swiss Consul at Manchester, which post he held until October 1951, when he was transferred to London as Consul. Six years later (1957) he was sent to New York in the same capacity.

We wish Mr. Huber best success in his new sphere of activity. ST.
