## ALL TO WIMBLEDON!



Next Tuesday evening, the Swiss people of London and its suburbs will meet once again at Wimbledon Town Hall to celebrate National Day. Let us hope they will be as numerous as ever!

We believe that it is not much to ask to gather together, once a year, and devote our memory to our beloved homeland. Whether in London, Vancouver or Singapore, the Swiss know very well they would be nothing without the country to which they owe everything. Let us also remember that, as Charles Maurras once said, "Of all human liberties the most precious is the independence of the Fatherland".

Last year, Mr. Stauffer wrote in these columns — "Patriotism is the vital condition of national permanence; no government is safe unless it is protected by the goodwill of the people; patriotism means: one country, one constitution, one destiny." This is just as true to-day as it was twelve months ago. Neither patriotism nor nationalism are outdated ideas.

But, to exist, a country must have a people with faith and trust in it, whether these people be near or far from their homeland. And we feel that Switzerland is still a very lively country, faithfully cherished by all its citizens, wherever they are.
