committee, and the Cercle Genevois. For nearly ten years, he was Chairman of the Advisory Council of the Swiss Observer. He served the Swiss Economic Council for many years as Honorary Treasurer. He was an ardent Free Mason, Past Master of the "Entente Cordiale" Lodge, and a member of the Helvetica Lodge.

Mr. R. de Cintra was born in 1892 in São Paulo (Brazil), and shortly after his birth his parents returned to Geneva, where his father became a medical practitioner. In that town, he received his schooling, and, after having spent one year with the Banque Hentsch, came to London at the age of twenty-one, taking up a post with the firm of G. Dimier Bros. In the early thirties, he became a director, and then Managing Director, of the Omega Watch Company. Some three years ago, as a tribute for his work at Omega, he was appointed Chairman. He enjoyed a great reputation in the watch trade. Since the death of his wife, a few years ago, he had suffered ill health, and he never seemed to recover his former zest for living. He fell seriously ill last August, with cancer of the lung, and on 15th November died in his chair by the fire. He leaves a son and two daughters, to whom we extend our sincere sympathy in their great loss.
