TWO INTERNATIONAL FAIRS AT BASLE IN 1962

In addition to the 46th Swiss Industries Fair (31st March to 10th April), two big international fairs are scheduled to be held in Basle in 1962. The first to take place, from 26th May to 3rd June, will be the 3rd International Trade Fair for the Wood-Working Industry. Planned on a larger scale than its two predecessors, this third Fair, with its large number of Swiss and International exhibitors, will give an overall view of the most recent appliances and machinery available for the wood-working industries and crafts, as well as forestry. The second of these fairs is "ILMAC", the 2nd International Exhibition and Congress of Laboratory, Measurement and Automation Techniques in Chemistry, which will be held from 15th to 20th October. This exhibition has already made a great name for itself as a specialised fair in a clearly defined and very important field. As in 1959, the Swiss Association of Chemists and the Swiss Association of Automation will again be organising an International Scientific Congress at which problems selected from the thematic material of the Exhibition will be discussed.
