"SWITZERLAND — A COUNTRY OF WELCOMES"

When a French magazine asked André Gide what he thought of Switzerland, the author of "La Symphonie pastorale" promptly replied: "They say it is a country of hotels. Why not put it more nicely and say it is a country of welcomes?"

This is a charming definition! Better still, André Gide said that the Swiss hotel industry, so highly esteemed by every traveller, "is only turning an honest penny out of the genius for hospitality and the spirit of service that animate it."

Switzerland — a peace-loving country open to the world! In this connection the author of "Les Faux-Monnayeurs" recalls the countless visitors and the many different musicians and men of letters who have found sustenance there for their peculiar genius: Sainte-Beuve, Romain Rolland, Nietzsche, Wagner, Rilke, Thomas Mann, and so many others.

But, apart from its "genius for welcome", Switzerland, Gide claims, is a school of the will, endurance and solidarity in adversity. There is no country where man is induced to make more of circumstances and of himself. Which makes the famous writer say: "And so it is not merely better physical health I have found whenever I have come to Switzerland in search of it; every time I have also found myself in better moral trim as well."

And he finishes his praise of Switzerland with these moving words: "If man's spirit ever returns later to haunt the places it has loved, I can imagine mine, released from worry and care, seeking round about Zurich and Lausanne, in the high valleys of the Engadine, in the Swiss Jura or on the quiet shores of Neuchâtel, to revive memories which are delightful beyond all others and to live again some of the dearest moments of my life."

Surely these lines deserve to grace any anthology on "Travel in Switzerland".
