AN EXAMPLE TO FOLLOW

The consular district of Dusseldorf in Germany counts 4,400 registered Swiss citizens. Of these, **every ninth** is a member of the Solidarity Fund of the Swiss Abroad. This is a remarkable achievement, considering that only every thirty-sixth Swiss abroad belongs to the Fund.

Over one-and-a-half million francs have already been paid out to nearly two hundred members who have lost their livelihood. Most of them came from the Congo, Algeria, Egypt and Tunisia.

We who are lucky enough to live in a politically and economically stable country may not feel the need to insure against such a risk. But that is exactly the reason why we should join in order to show our solidarity with our fellow countrymen who are less fortunate. Besides, we do not lose our contributions; we get a large amount back in old age — the younger we join, the higher the refund.

Everyone may join for as little as two or three pounds a year, if not as an active member, at least as a donor.
