## RECENT DEATHS IN SWITZERLAND

The following deaths have been reported from Switzerland:

- Walter Alvarez Keller (57), Zurich, author, especially of South American novels which he wrote following his many years' residence in Brazil.
- Albert von Steiger (84), Berne, former Cantonal Engineer; brother of the late Federal Councillor.
- Madame Markhoff-Thiébaud, young Neuchâtel missionary, mother of five children; and
- M. Waldvogel, young teacher missionary from Herblingen (Schaffhausen), both murdered at Bangangté, a village in Cameroun.
- Plinio Zanolini (64), Muralto/Locarno, for 39 years director of the Muralto schools and member of the Ticino Parliament; Justice of the Peace.
- Alois Ehrler-auf der Maur (77), Schwyz, farmer and cattle breeder; Conservative member of the Schwyz Cantonal Council and Tribunal.
- Dr. K. Imhoff (90), Zurich, well-known expert on water and its use; author of several books on waste water plants, etc.; died in Essen.
- Alfred Nussbaum (73), Geneva, Radical member of the Grand Council for over 25 years; several times Commune President of Carouge.
- Dr. oec. publ. Friedrich Bernet (67), Zollikon, for many years in U.S.A. and Canada; expert on economics; teacher and politician; one-time editor of the "Schweizerische Arbeitgeber-Zeitung"; Council member of the "Schweizeriischer Fachpresseverband".
- Karl Schill (68), Lucerne, co-proprietor of printing works of Schill & Co. founded by his father in 1876.
- Sergio de Pedrini (25), Lugano, football referee; died during a match.
- Mrs. Léonie Grauwiler-Guggenbühl (80), Basle, former owner of the well-known jeweller's shop established over 100 years by her father.
- Max Picard (77), Lugano, prominent writer and philosopher; art critic; author of the famous book "Das Menschengesicht".
- Dr. iur. Paul Popp (58), St. Gall, lawyer and judge; he was to be nominated candidate as Federal Judge by the Conservative/Christian Socialists.
- Dr. iur. T. Gubler (65), Zurich, lawyer in Winterthur; active in art and education, literature and politics (Libertl); journalist in Germany until the Nazi movement became strong; killed in a road accident on a business trip in New York.
- Martin Schaffner (43), Suhr, called "Bomber Schaffner" for his work in salvaging several planes, American, German and Swiss, from the Lake of Constance and other lakes; traded extensively in petrol and oil all over Switzerland; also started a transport firm; popular Personality weighing nearly 200 kilos.
- Patrick Guinness, half-brother to the Aga Khan, killed on the road between Sion and Brig while driving a sports car.
- Carl Felber (66), Winterthur, machine engineer; for 19 years in charge of the section heating and air conditioning with Sulzer Brothers; in the army he had the rank of a Colonel; Chief of Artillery in the Fifth Division since 1949.
- Canon Roduit (77), St. Maurice, director of the "Grande Ecole" at Bagnes, then vicar of Finaut, Vollèges and Lavey; chaplain of Bagnes, rector of Verbier and almoner of Sainte-Ame; "Doyen des Paroisses de la Juridiction Abbatiale".

- Otto Haab (33), Kollbrunn (Zurich), Swissair pilot; was killed during army manoeuvres when his "Venom" plane crashed in the Bergell; army rank of First Lieutenant.
- Edvino Pessina (88), Lugano, for many years member of the Lugano Town Council; first general agent of any insurance company in the Ticino.
- Dr. E. Kaltenbach (76), Basle, well-known sports journalist and sports editor of "Tip" and "Basler Woche"; former member of the Swiss national football team.
- Prof. Dr. Hans Pallmann (62), Zurich, President of the Swiss School Council since 1949; professor of agriculture at the ETH whose Principal he became in 1947; authors of several scientific books; member of many Swiss and foreign scientific organisations; Honorary Doctor of Vienna University; the President of the Confederation attended the funeral at the Zurich Fraumünster Church.
- Dr. phil. Paul Mueller (66), Basle, research chemist in the firm of Geigy A.G.; was awarded the Nobel Prize for Physiology and Medicine in 1948 (pesticide DDT).
- Fritz Born, Muri (Berne), banker; former manager of the Union Bank of Switzerland.
- Fritz Maron (73), Arosa, for many years editor of the "Aroser Zeitung" and very active in many spheres concerning Arosa as a tourist centre; Liberal member of the Grisons Parliament for one period; his bestknown book is "Arosa, vom Bergbauerndorf zum Weltkurort".
- Secondo Monotti (74), Locarno, from 1923-1963 editor and later director of "Il Paese", the official Party organ of the Ticino Farmers' Party (BGB Partei).
- Fritz von Allmen (75), Interlaken, well-known hotelier in the Bernese Oberland, especially as owner of the Kleine Scheidegg Hotels; Bernese "Grossrat" and for twelve years National Councillor.
- André Stueby from Moudon, dipl. ing. agr. ETH, missionary on Kalimantan in Indonesia (Basle Mission).
- Dr. Frank Victor (70), Zurich, graphologist and author.
- Dr. h.c. med. et phil. Hans Zulliger (72), Ittigen (Berne), dialect author and children's psychologist; for 45 years teacher at Ittigen; secretary of the Swiss Society for Psycho-Analysis; editor for 22 years of the "Elternzeitschrift"; Member of Honour of many Swiss and foreign organisations; Honorary Doctor of Berne and Heidelberg.

Albert Buergi (50), Rheinfelden, "Stadtbannwart.

André Meylan, Renens (Vaud), Radical member of the Vaudois Parliament; Vice-President of the Employers' Federation of Vaud.
