### CHRISTMAS DINNER

On coffee being served the president, Mr. M. A. Keller, proposed the *Toasts* to H.M. the Queen and "La Suisse". He also voiced his pleasure at seeing such a good attendance.

A short business meeting followed at which a new Honorary Member was elected with acclamation in the person of Mr. Jules Zimmermann, who on the 2nd of June this year completed fifty years of membership. Mr. Zimmermann, who was for many years Honorary Secretary of the Club, rendering sterling services to our Society and to the Colony at large richly deserves this honour bestowed on him. There were also some new members elected.

The business part being closed the company vigorously burst into song with the accompaniment of two very energetic accordionists. In between singing and accordion playing some of the members and their friends told some very funny, and mostly "drawing room" stories, and Mr. J. Heimerdinger gave a humorous address in French.

Before leaving the Dorchester Hotel, Mr. Keller wished the members and their families a Happy Christmas and a Prosperous New Year. He thanked Mr. G. A. Ronus for the always generous hospitality the Hotel Management extends to the Club. Everyone departed from Park Lane in a joyful spirit having spent a gay and happy evening in congenial company.
