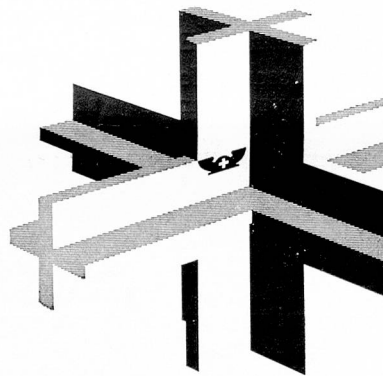
On 30th March it was forty years since the death of Rudolf Steiner, founder of the Anthroposophical Society whose headquarters are at Dornach (Solothurn).
