"SWITZERLAND'S AMAZING RAILWAYS"

By CECIL J. ALLEN

This railway classic has been enlarged and improved to such an extent that it is in many respects a new book. The text and appendix of tables — unique in the literature of Swiss mountain transport — have been brought up to date throughout: times, distances, termini, etc., have all been revised wherever necessary. The previous illustrations have been carefully checked, 24 new plates replace existing ones, and eight extra plates have been added, making over 200 dramatic and revealing pictures of Swiss railways and landscapes.

Recent developments in Swiss Railway engineering techniques have been extensive, especially in the building of new and progressively more daring suspension lines to even greater altitudes. These developments are reflected in a new chapter Mr. Allen has written, bringing his engrossing story completely up to date. Cecil J. Allen, himself a railway engineer, is one of the most prolific and experienced of present-day railway writers. This book is based on forty years' first-hand knowledge of Switzerland's railways.
