A REMINDER

As was announced in the last issue of the "Swiss Observer", the Nouvelle Société Helvétique present "L'ECHO ROMAND", a Swiss Folklore Evening on Monday, 4th July. Details are given in the advertisement below.

The London Group of the N.S.H. celebrate their 50th anniversary this summer, and the Folklore Evening is one of the events the Society are organising to mark the Golden Jubilee.

The Choir of the "Echo Romand" was founded in Berne in 1950 and is a member of the "Association Cantonale des Chanteurs Vaudois". They are well known in Switzerland, and their music may also be heard on records.

The Dance Group, also affiliated to the Vaudois organisation, is considered one of the best in Switzerland.

It consists of twelve couples, and their average age is 22.

Whilst the dancers will appear in Vaudois costumes, The Choir will be wearing national costumes from all the *Cantons Romands*.

The Rustic Trio is made up of a clarinet, a double-bass and an accordion. The soloist will be Pierre Gagnebin (Bass).

The whole group, sixty strong, will perform classic and folkloristic, popular as well as traditional numbers, and the evening promises to be a very pleasant and enjoyable one.

As the Swiss artists are offering this entertainment to the Colony free of charge, it has been possible to keep prices of admission low — just to cover expenses like the hire of the hall, etc.

Reserve the date — it should be a rewarding event.
